Trumpet, Pitcher, Torch Game Answer Key

Divide the class into two or three teams. On the board write three names: "Gideon," "The Lord," and "One of Gideon's 300."

Team members will first draw a card from the Trumpet, Pitcher, Torch Game Point Cards. Trumpet cards = 100 points, Pitcher cards = 200 points, and Torch cards = 300 points. Then they will draw a Character Question. Have them answer the questions quickly—in a matter of seconds—to make the play more exciting and challenging.

If the playing team answers correctly, award the number of points drawn. List points on the board or just have the team start a collection of point cards and add them together at the end. If a team answers incorrectly, let the next team answer or put the question back in the drawing cup to be used again.

Play repeats, alternating between teams, until all the questions have been answered or time is up. Congratulate the team who has earned the most points.


