Look up the verses below. Find the River Rock that describes the miracle. Write the Scripture verse on the rock and place the rock in the “river.”

- a. 2 Kings 2:21–22
- b. 2 Kings 2:11
- c. 2 Kings 6:16–17
- d. 2 Kings 2:14
- e. 2 Kings 2:8
- f. 2 Kings 5:14
- g. 2 Kings 6:2–7

The Bible records many of the miracles that the prophets did. Remember, the prophets were able to do these miracles only by God’s power. They had no power of their own. They trusted God and were faithful men of God. And God used them to accomplish His plans. They weren’t perfect, but they were willing and obedient as God called them. Miracles Answer Key

Print one Miracles worksheet for each team. Keep the answer key for your use.

GAME DIRECTIONS

Divide the class into teams of 2–4 students. Pass out one Miracles worksheet and one set of River Rocks to each team. Designate an area for each team’s “river”—across the room, down the hall, etc. The object of the game is to place the rocks down and cross the river on the rocks.

Teams will look up the Scriptures on the worksheet and find the rock that describes that miracle. They will place the rock in the “river” and continue until all their rocks have made a way for them to get across the river

- a. 2 Kings 2:21–22 Elisha put salt in the source of Jericho’s water because it was bad. The Lord healed the water.
- b. 2 Kings 2:11 Elijah was taken to heaven by a chariot of fire in a whirlwind.
- c. 2 Kings 6:16–17 The servant’s eyes were opened to see the horses and chariots of fire around Elisha.
- d. 2 Kings 2:14 Elisha parted the Jordan with Elijah’s mantle.
- e. 2 Kings 2:8 Elijah struck the Jordan with his mantle, the water parted and he and Elisha walked across on dry ground.
- f. 2 Kings 5:14 Naaman was healed of his leprosy when he dipped in the Jordan River seven times just as Elisha told him.
- g. 2 Kings 6:2–7 Elisha caused an iron ax head to float.
