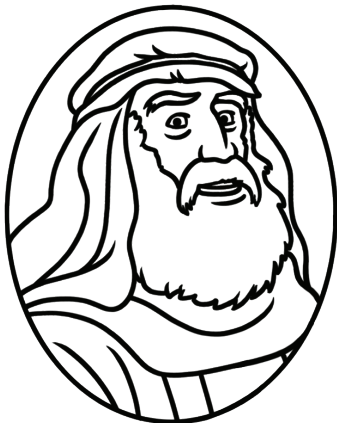

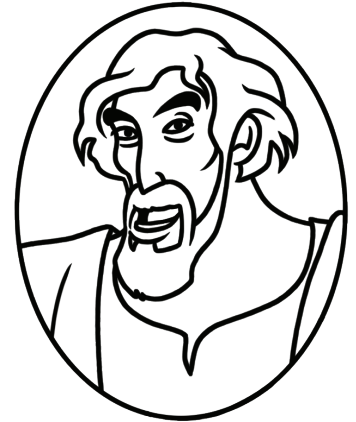
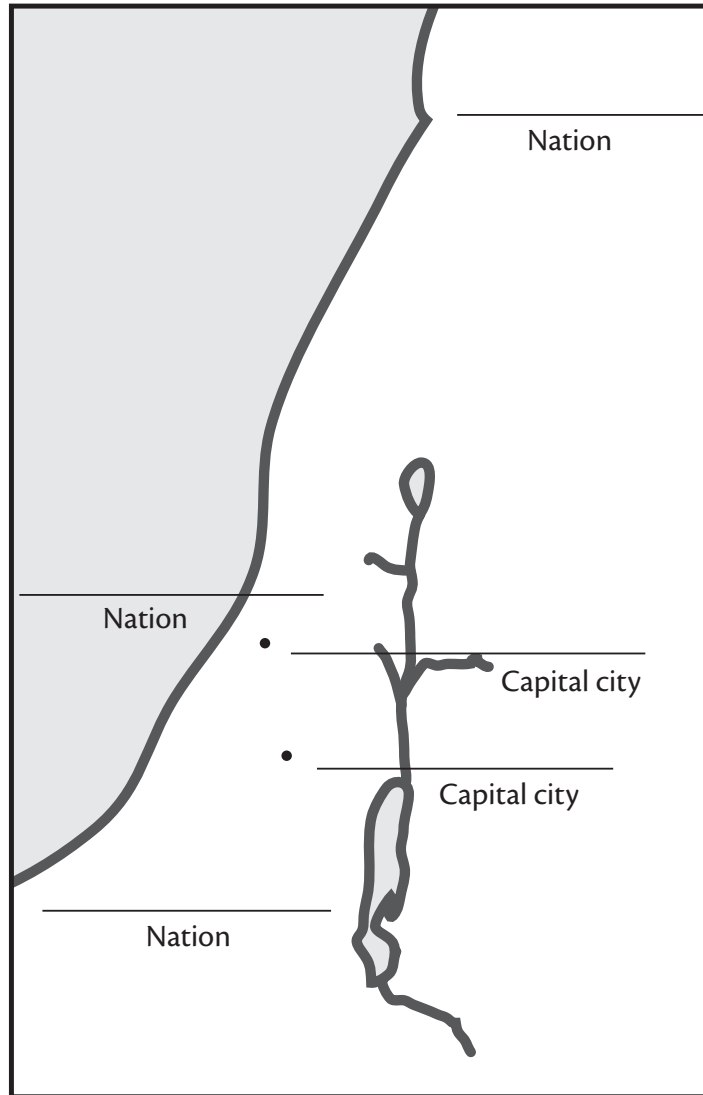

# Review Map Script

*Print one Review Map for each student. Keep this script for your use. After students have completed the map during the Come On In activity, discuss it with them. Include the following points as you discuss.*

1. God divided the nation of Israel into two nations, **Israel** and **Judah**. The kings of Israel all did evil in the sight of the Lord. In Judah, most of the kings were evil, but there were some who did what was right in the eyes of the Lord.
2. The first king of Israel was **Jeroboam**, Solomon's servant.
3. The first king of Judah was **Rehoboam**, Solomon's son.
4. The capital of Israel was **Samaria**.
5. The capital of Judah was **Jerusalem**.
6. **Assyria** was the nation to the north of Israel. This was the nation God used to judge the people of Israel for their sins of idolatry and disobedience to God.
7. God sent **Amos** to Israel to warn the people to repent and turn back to God or God's judgment would come.
8. God used **Hosea** the prophet and Hosea's wife Gomer to show the people in Israel that He loved them. As Hosea forgave his wife when she left him, so God would forgive His people for their idolatry if they would return to Him.
9. God's prophet **Nahum** delivered a message to Nineveh, the capital city of Assyria—after they destroyed Israel. The message was the same. Return to God or God would punish them.
