to the text.

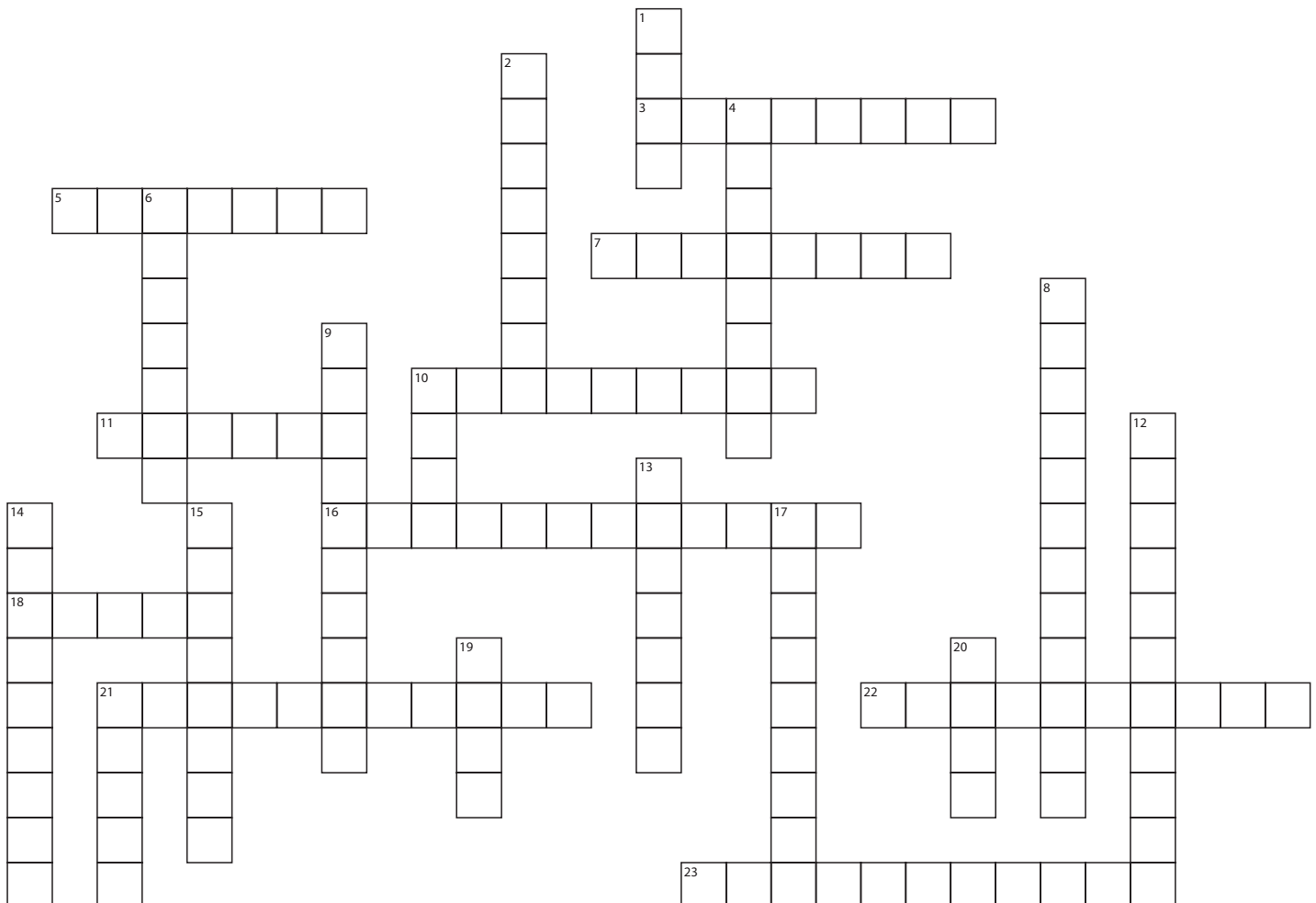
2 Timothy 3:16: “All Scripture is given by **(12-D)** of God,
