Days of Creation Answer Key

- 1. Genesis 1:1-5
 - a. On Day One God created: heavens, earth, light.
 - b. God divided the **light** from the **darkness**.
 - c. The light He called <u>day</u>. The darkness He called <u>night</u>.
- 2. Genesis 1:6-8
 - a. On Day Two God created: the **firmament** or **expanse** that separated the **waters** above from the waters below.
 - b. This formed the **<u>atmosphere</u>**—the stuff we **<u>breathe</u>**.
- 3. Genesis 1:9–13
 - a. On Day Three God created: dry land, earth, seas, grass, herbs, plants, fruit trees.
- 4. Genesis 1:14-19
 - a. On Day Four God created: the <u>sun</u> to rule the <u>day</u>, the <u>moon</u> to rule the <u>night</u>, and the <u>stars</u>.
- 5. Genesis 1:20-23
 - a. On Day Five God created: great sea creatures and every winged bird.
- 6. Genesis 1:24-27
 - a. On Day Six God created: the cattle, creeping things, the beasts of the earth—or all the <u>land</u> <u>animals</u>.
 - b. God also created the first **people**.
 - c. God named the first people <u>Adam</u> and <u>Eve</u>. They were created in <u>God's</u> <u>image</u>.
- 7. Genesis 1:31
 - a. God saw everything that He had made, and behold, it was very good.
- 8. Genesis 1:5, 1:8, 1:13, 1:19, 1:23, 1:31
 - a. So the **<u>evening</u>** and the **<u>morning</u>** were the [first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth] <u>day</u>.
- 9. These were **normal**, **<u>24-hour</u>** days.
