Digging up the Past Video Answer Key

ABRAHAM IN EGYPT

- 1. Abraham may have brought the mathematical and scientific understanding that helped Pharaoh **Kufu** build the Great Pyramid.
- 2. The historian <u>Josephus</u> records that Abraham brought the knowledge of mathematics and astronomy to the Egyptians.
- 3. Genesis 12 records the encounter between Abraham and the Egyptian royalty.

JOSEPH IN EGYPT

- 4. Joseph was sold to Midianite traders after his brothers threw him in a cistern in **Dothan**.
- 5. In the shortened chronology Dr. Down is advocating, Pharaoh **Sesostris I** was ruling Egypt at the time of the famine.
- 6. Joseph married a daughter of the priest of On and is likely identified as **Mentuhutep** from Egyptian records.
- 7. Paintings show Semitic people in the Twelfth Dynasty, and there is a record of a **famine** in this period where food was stored.

MOSES IN EGYPT

- 8. **Sesostris III** was likely the pharaoh described in Exodus 1:8 who reigned after Joseph's death.
- 9. In the remains of the pyramid of Amenemhet III, there are mud bricks laced with **straw**, just as we would expect if this were the pharaoh of Exodus 1.
- 10. Amenemhet III only had a **daughter**, Sobeknefru, who had no children.
- 11. When Sobeknefru found Moses in the reeds, she was likely at the river for religious reasons, worshipping the **fertility** god, Hapi.

EXODUS FROM EGYPT

- 12. Secular historians cannot properly identify large groups of foreigners living in Egypt because they are looking in the wrong **time period**.
- 13. The excavations at Kahun uncovered wooden boxes with the remains of **babies** in them, possibly from the babies killed by the Egyptians as described in Exodus 1:15–18.
- 14. Judging by the articles left behind at Kahun, the slaves left **quickly**, and this is explained as the Israelites departed after the plagues from God.
