Hail and fire (lightning)	9:23–26	Agreed to set the slaves free and later changed his mind as his heart was hardened	Pharaoh's servants hardened their hearts (v. 34)	Nut goddess of the sky; the severe storm came from the sky
Locusts	10:12, 10:16–20	Agreed to let the men go to worship and then changed his mind as his heart was hardened	Pled to let the slaves go	Seth god of vegetation; the locusts consumed all of the vegetation in Egypt
Darkness	10:21–23, 10:27–29	Agreed to let them go with- out their flocks and then changed his mind as his heart was hardened	Not mentioned	Ra god of the sun; even when the sun was out, there was darkness
Death of the firstborn	11:4–9	With a hard heart, he refused to release them	Not mentioned	Pharaoh held to be a god; he could not prevent the death of his own son
