JEREMIAH 2:5-7—WHY WAS GOD ANGRY WITH JUDAH?

- 1. What had the people done to make God angry?
 - a. They had gone far from God.
 - b. They had worshipped idols.
- 2. The people had <u>forgotten</u> what the Lord had done for them.

JEREMIAH 4:1-2—WHAT DID GOD WANT FROM THE PEOPLE?

- 3. What did the Lord ask the people to do? Return to Him.
- 4. The Lord lives in *truth*, in *judgment*, and in *righteousness*.

JEREMIAH 4:6-7, 5:19—GOD'S WARNING TO JUDAH

- 5. What was the Lord bringing to Zion (Jerusalem)? Disaster from the north and great destruction.
- 6. The Lord warned Judah that a fierce enemy, like a <u>lion</u> would come. It would be the nation of <u>Babylon</u>.
- 7. Why was God going to bring disaster upon His people? <u>They had forsaken Him and served other, foreign gods.</u>
- 8. God was going to send the people out of the land and they would serve "aliens." An alien in this context is a <u>stranger</u> or a <u>foreigner</u>.
- 9. The nation that God sent—the lion from the north—was Babylon.
