PART 1

- 1. Who was the king in Ezra's day? King Artaxerxes of *Persia.*
- 2. How did Ezra describe himself in verses 6 and 11? He was a scribe, a priest, and an expert in the words of the commandments of the Lord.
- 3. What important information do we learn about Ezra in verse 10? He had prepared his heart to seek and do the Law of the Lord so that he could teach the people of Israel to obey God.
- 4. What was to be taken to Jerusalem? Silver and gold along with other things offered freely by the people.
- 5. What different names are given for God in the king's letter? God of Israel, God of Jerusalem, the God of Heaven, God, your God.

6. What phrase is repeated again in verse 28? God's hand was upon Ezra.

PART 2

- 7. Where was Ezra during his prayer? He was in front of the Temple.
- 8. Who spoke on behalf of the people? Shechaniah.
- 9. What was Shechaniah's plan for restoration? He proposed that they make a covenant with God to divorce the pagan wives. He also suggested that Ezra administer the process.
- **10. How did Ezra respond to this proposal?** He agreed with it, and there was a call for the men of Judah and Benjamin to assemble in three days at Jerusalem.
- 11. What does the amount of mourning, fasting, and weeping indicate about the response of the Jews to their sin? They must have been truly broken for violating God's Law, and their outward reactions were expressions of that inward grief for sin.
