

# Real World Skit

## Which Came First?

**Cast:** John, Ashley, Dylan, Narrator (Suggest teacher to play this role)

**Props:** Hard-boiled egg, Bible

**NARRATOR:** Dylan looked at his egg with a confused expression. His friends, John and Ashley, came over to play and noticed something was wrong.

*Dylan shows them the egg. John and Ashley each take turns holding up the egg, looking closely at it while Dylan tells them his problem.*

**DYLAN:** I can't figure out which came first, the chicken or the egg.

**NARRATOR:** John and Ashley smiled and patted him on the shoulder. They knew the solution to that problem and were glad that they would be able to help their friend.

**ASHLEY:** *Ashley opens up her Bible and turns to the very first book, Genesis 1. God created the entire universe in six normal 24-hour days. He created all the birds and fish on the fifth day.*

**JOHN:** *Opening his Bible to Genesis. That's right. God spoke and everything was created. All the animals, plants, fish, birds, and even man and woman!*

**DYLAN:** Well, that's interesting but how does that answer my question?

**JOHN:** Good question! Take a look in here. *John shows Dylan his Bible again, Genesis 1:22.*

**JOHN:** God created the animals and then said, go and be fruitful and multiply. That means, he created them first, THEN told them to start their families.

**ASHLEY:** You see, the Bible has the answer. God did not create the egg first. He created the chickens first so they could lay eggs and begin their families resulting in lots and lots of chickens.

**ASHLEY:** So, Dylan, the answer to your question is . . .

**JOHN and ASHLEY TOGETHER SHOUT:** The chicken came first, then the egg!

**NARRATOR:** But this just left Dylan even more confused.

**DYLAN:** If God made chickens and everything else, then who made God?

**NARRATOR:** Now, you might think that John and Ashley would be stumped by this question, scratching their heads and rubbing their chins, wondering how they should answer their friend Dylan. But that did not happen. They had answers for Dylan in their Bible.

**JOHN:** *Turning back to Genesis 1:1 in his Bible.* The Bible says in the beginning, God. This means that God was there in the beginning and He has always been.

**ASHLEY:** That's right. If someone had to make God, then someone would have had to make that someone, and someone would have to make that someone, and on and on . . .

**JOHN:** Yes, we know that everything has to be created—but that thinking doesn't work when we are talking about the very beginning of creation. There had to be someone in the beginning who was not created, someone who has always been. Someone who started everything!

**DYLAN:** *Shouting.* I get it now! God was first! He had to create the first chicken before the first egg . . . but nothing could have made God. He has always been. Something or someone had to start it all . . . and the Bible says that was God! And we are going to believe what God says! Right?

**ASHLEY and JOHN TOGETHER:** Right!

**DYLAN:** Thanks guys. It makes a little more sense now!
