

True or Lie Statements

The teacher will read each statement and the children will hold up either the True card if the statement is true, or the Lie card if the statement is a lie.

In between statements, encourage discussion by asking the following questions:

- What if I believe this is true, does that make it true?
- What if your friend doesn't believe this, is it still true?
- Does someone have to believe this for it to be true?
