## Kings of Israel and Judah Scripture Sheet

## KINGS OF ISRAEL

- **1 Kings 14:9** (a message from God for <u>leroboam</u> as spoken by the prophet Ahijah) <sup>9</sup> but you have done more evil than all who were before you, for you have gone and made for yourself other gods and molded images to provoke Me to anger, and have cast Me behind your back.
- **1 Kings 15:25–26** <sup>25</sup> Now <u>Nadab</u> the son of Jeroboam became king over Israel in the second year of Asa king of Judah, and he reigned over Israel two years. <sup>26</sup> And he did evil in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the way of his father, and in his sin by which he had made Israel sin.
- 1 Kings 15:33–34 <sup>33</sup> In the third year of Asa king of Judah, <u>Baasha</u> the son of Ahijah became king over all Israel in Tirzah, and reigned twenty-four years. <sup>34</sup> He did evil in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the way of Jeroboam, and in his sin by which he had made Israel sin.
- **1 Kings 16:25** <sup>25</sup> Omri did evil in the eyes of the Lord, and did worse than all who were before him.
- **1 Kings 16:30** <sup>30</sup> Now <u>Ahab</u> the son of Omri did evil in the sight of the Lord, more than all who were before him.
- **1 Kings 22:51–52** <sup>51</sup> <u>Ahaziah</u> the son of Ahab became king over Israel in Samaria in the seventeenth year of Jehoshaphat king of Judah, and reigned two years over Israel. <sup>52</sup> He did evil in the sight of the Lord, and walked in the way of

his father and in the way of his mother and in the way of Jeroboam the son of Nebat, who had made Israel sin.

## KINGS OF JUDAH

- **2 Chronicles 12:1, 12:14** <sup>1</sup> Now it came to pass, when <u>Rehoboam</u> had established the kingdom and had strengthened himself, that he forsook the law of the Lord, and all Israel along with him. . . . <sup>14</sup> And [Rehoboam] did evil, because he did not prepare his heart to seek the Lord.
- **1 Kings 15:11** <sup>11</sup> <u>Asa</u> did what was right in the eyes of the Lord, as did his father David.
- **1 Kings 22:43** <sup>43</sup> And [Jehoshaphat] walked in all the ways of his father Asa. He did not turn aside from them, doing what was right in the eyes of the Lord.
- **2 Kings 18:3, 18:5–6** <sup>3</sup> And [King <u>Hezekiah</u>] did what was right in the sight of the Lord, according to all that his father David had done. ... <sup>5</sup> He trusted in the Lord God of Israel, so that after him was none like him among all the kings of Judah, nor who were before him. <sup>6</sup> For he held fast to the Lord; he did not depart from following Him, but kept His commandments, which the Lord had commanded Moses.
- **2 Kings 24:19** <sup>19</sup> [Zedekiah] also did evil in the sight of the Lord, according to all that Jehoiakim had done.
