American Idols Script

Characters: Taylor, Lucy, Noah, Bentley

The kids are leaving the after-school Bible Club.

Taylor: Hey, Lucy and Bentley! I'm so glad you guys came to Bible Club. Did you like what we talked about?

Lucy: Everyone was really nice. And it was interesting. It's just that I'm not sure I get all of that stuff about God being jealous. Didn't Mrs. Emerson say that in the Old Testament the prophets warned the people because God was jealous?

Noah: Yes! Exactly. The people were worshipping idols and not worshipping God alone. God wants all of our worship and praise. He wants to be the most important thing in our life.

Lucy: But, I just don't get it. How is God jealous? I thought being jealous was bad. It's like God is selfish or something. He wants every single thing for Himself.

Bentley: That's right. And my mom told me that I shouldn't be jealous. I shouldn't want what other people have. It is kind of selfish. Is God selfish?

Taylor: No! God isn't selfish at all. He is only good. When the Bible tells us God is jealous, it means that He wants all of our attention, praise, and worship.

- **Bentley:** You were? I think I would be, too, if my mom took my TV away. So, you don't have a TV anymore?
- **Taylor:** Nope. My parents knew it wasn't good for me.
- Noah: The same thing happened to me! Do you guys remember last summer? I got those LEGOs for my birthday. That is all I could think about! It was all I did for months! And, I didn't want anyone doing it with me. It was bad. My parents finally had to
