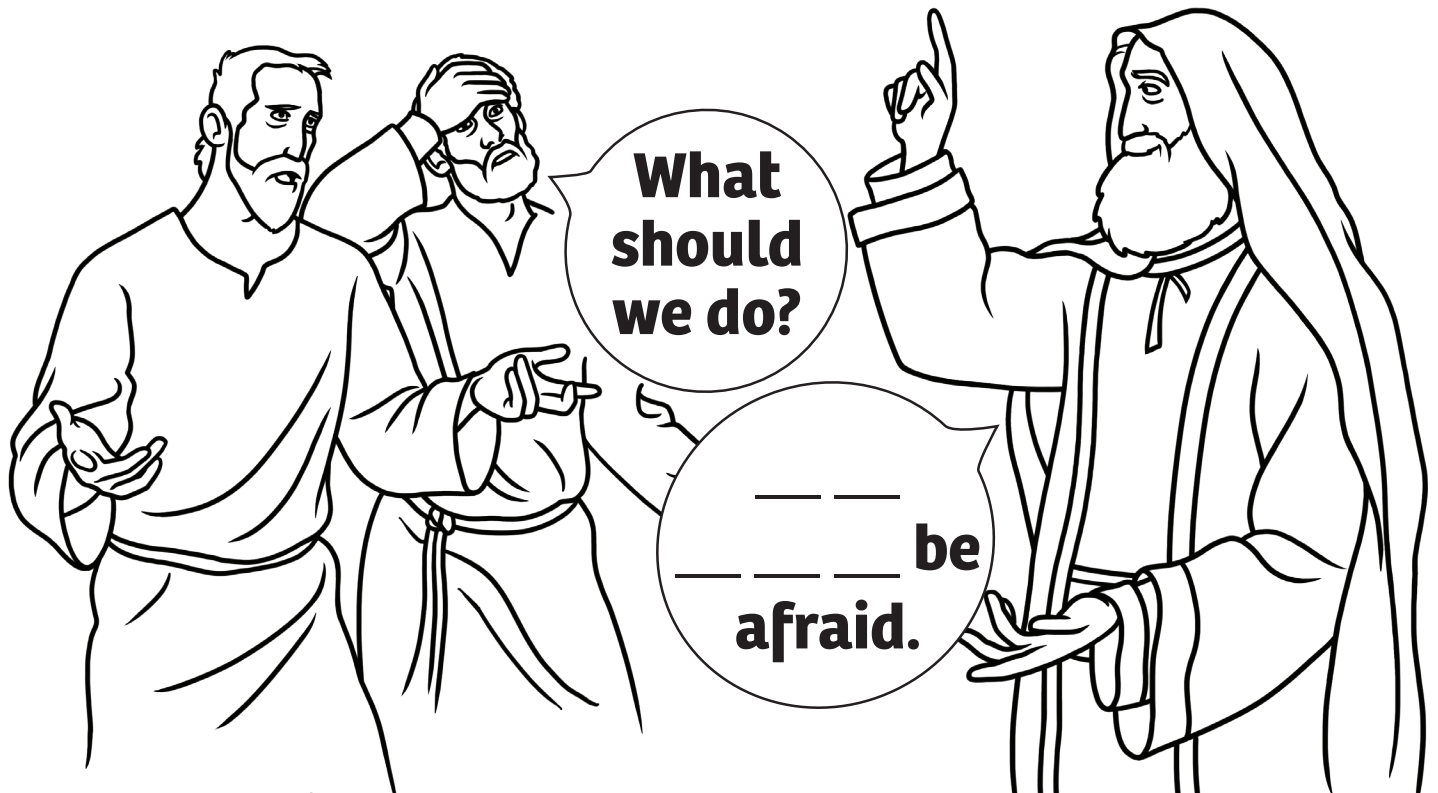

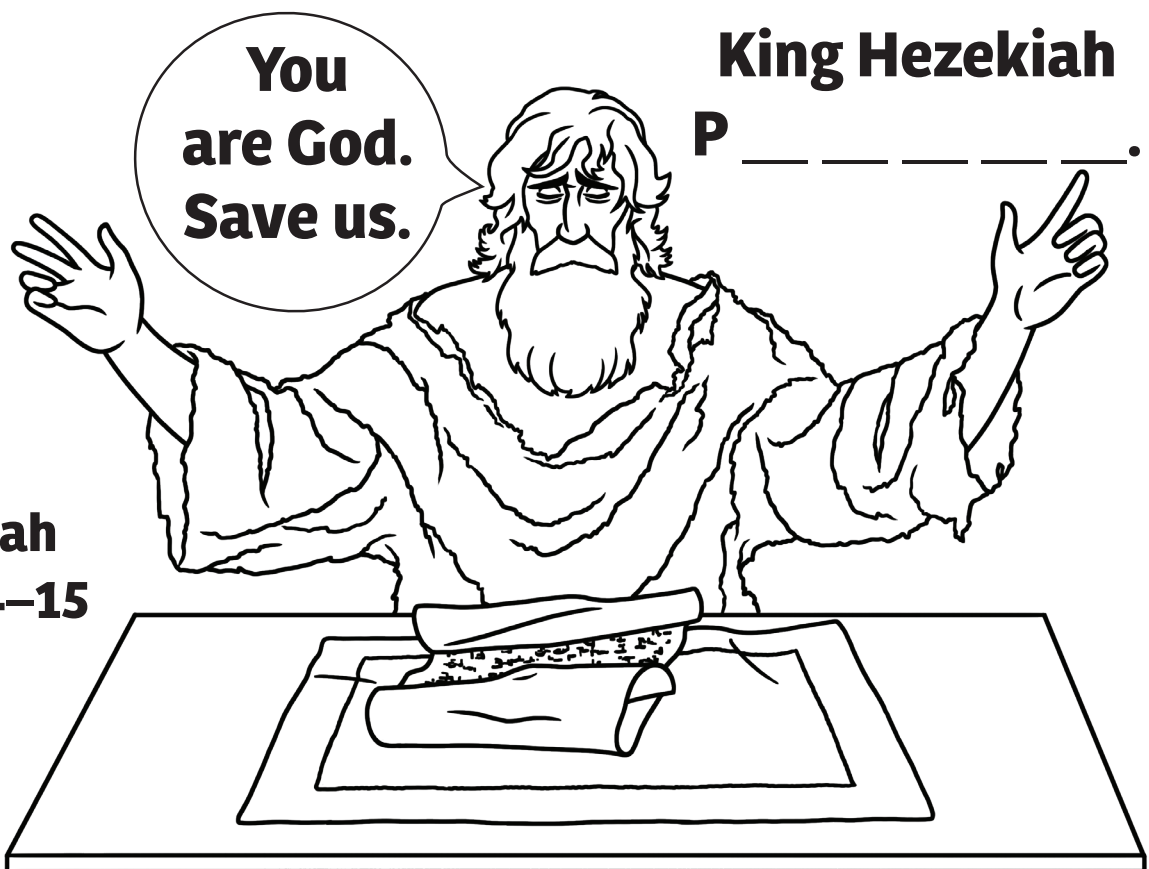

## PAGE 1

The Rabshakeh, or messenger of the Assyrian king, told the people in Judah they should not trust the Lord or their king, Hezekiah. He was threatening them and had many Assyrian soldiers with him.

## PAGE 2

King Hezekiah's men asked Isaiah what they should do. Isaiah told them not to be afraid.

## PAGE 3

King Hezekiah received a letter from the Assyrian king. He said, "I will destroy your nation. Do not trust your God."

## PAGE 4

After King Hezekiah got the letter, he went into the House of the Lord and prayed, "You are God. Save us."

## PAGE 5

God spoke through Isaiah. Isaiah told King Hezekiah and Judah that no enemies would come into their city, no arrow would be shot, and God would defend them.

## PAGE 6

The Angel of the Lord killed most of the Assyrian soldiers—185,000—silently in the middle of the night while they were sleeping in their camp. When the Assyrians who were spared woke up, they saw all of the dead bodies.
