

Puppet Role Play Script

You can interact with the puppet, answering the questions yourself, or use two puppets to talk with each other. Allow the students to interact with the puppets as well.

Teacher: Boys and girls, I'd like to introduce some friends of mine! They heard that we've been learning all kinds of wonderful things from the Bible. So they asked me if they could come and talk with us and see if we can answer some of their questions.

Teacher: Here they are, [Puppet One and Puppet Two]. *Introduce their names and have them greet the children.*

Puppet One: I'm so excited to be here! I like learning about the Bible.

Puppet Two: Me too! *Turns toward class.* So what special things have you been learning?

Teacher: We've been learning about creation. Do you have any questions that we can answer for you?

Puppet One: I saw a TV show that said it took millions of years for the earth to get like it is. Is that true?

Puppet Two: Hmm, I wonder what the Bible says. *Turns toward teacher.* Have you heard?

Teacher: Why, yes! *Turns toward class.* We've read what the Bible says in Genesis, haven't we class? The earth and the whole universe were created just 6,000 years ago!

Puppet One: Do the boys and girls know how long God took to create everything? I learned at church that it only took God six days to create everything! *Turns toward class.* Is that right?

Teacher and/or children: Yes! It only took God six days to create everything.

Puppet One: Wow! That isn't very long. He must be really powerful. He must be omnipotent! Does the Bible say it only took Him six days?

Teacher: Yes. That is in the Bible. The Bible is God's true Word. *Turns toward class.* We can believe everything in it. Isn't that right class? *Yes!*

Puppet Two: I have another question. If the same God created everything, why are people so different from animals?

Teacher: Well, we talked about that too. God did create everything. But people are God's very special creation. The Bible says people are created in God's image. That is what makes us different—and special.

Puppet One: What does that mean, though?

Puppet Two: I think I know. People can think, read, and write, but animals can't. *Turns toward teacher.* Isn't that right?

Teacher: Yes, and we can love. And best of all, we can learn about Jesus and be His friend!

Puppet Two: *Turns toward class.* What else can you do differently from the animals? *Allow for answers.*

Teacher: People are made in God's image. But God made some pretty amazing animals, though!

Puppet One: *Turns toward class with excitement.* Like my favorite—dinosaurs! But, did dinosaurs really exist?

Teacher: Oh, yes! The Bible describes animals that sound a lot like dinosaurs in the book of Job.

Puppet One: *Turns toward class.* But wouldn't that have been millions of years ago?

Puppet Two: No! God created everything in the entire universe just 6,000 years ago.

Puppet One: Only 6,000 years ago? But, my friend, Jessica, said her fossil rock was at least 1,000,000 years old!

Puppet Two: I'm afraid she's mistaken about that. That's not what the Bible says.

Puppet One: Really? But it's a fossil from a long time ago! *Turns toward class.* What does the Bible say?

Teacher: The Bible says the earth is only about 6,000 years old. So Jessica's fossil can't be any older than that!

Puppets together: Wow! That's amazing!

Teacher: Yes! God's Word is amazing! That's why it can be so much fun to read it and learn from it.

Puppet One: Thanks for letting us come and talk with you and your class! I learned a lot!

Puppet Two: Yes! I think I understand a lot of things better now too. *Turns toward class.* Thank you, everyone! Good bye!
