Thirsty Camels Script

Teacher assigns roles of Rebekah, the servant, and ten thirsty camels. Bring in simple costumes: a white scarf for Rebekah and a brown cape or robe for the servant. Help the children put on costume pieces and then feed lines for children who play the Rebekah and Servant characters. If they can't repeat the lines, read the lines for them and coach them to act out what is happening. Repeat the skit as time allows to give more children the opportunity to participate as Rebekah and the servant.

Teacher: God told Abraham to send his servant far away to find the perfect bride for Isaac. But how was he going to find the girl God had chosen for Isaac to marry? He would pray!

Servant: Servant kneels to pray. Dear God, please show me who you want Isaac to marry. Let the perfect bride say that she will give me a drink and water my camels!

Rebekah: I think I should go to the well and get water.

Servant: Will you please give me a drink of water?

Rebekah: Of course! And I will give your camels water, too!" Rebekah waters the thirsty camels.

Servant: Rebekah gave all my thirsty camels a drink, just like I prayed. This means God has shown me the perfect bride for Isaac. It is Rebekah!

Teacher: So Rebekah left her home to fulfill God's promise and marry Isaac. God answered the prayer and used the thirsty camels to help the servant find the perfect bride for Isaac! Have Rebekah, the servant, and the camels walk away together.
