

Lesson Review Script

Print one copy for use during the Come On In Activity. After children have colored the Lesson Review Coloring Sheets, they will tape them on the board as you describe briefly what occurred in the lesson. See script below. Be animated and enthused as you re-tell the lessons. Look at the pictures they are putting up. Gather the children around the board so they can see them better. Engage them!

LESSON 7

King Hezekiah loved the Lord. He was a good king! But the bad king of Assyria wanted to take over King Hezekiah's land. Hezekiah went to the House of the Lord and prayed that God would take care of him and his people. God sent Isaiah to King Hezekiah with a message that God would protect them. God answered King Hezekiah's prayer and sent the bad king of Assyria away.

LESSON 8

God sent the prophets to tell the people different things. The prophet Micah had good news to tell the people. His news was about Jesus. Micah told the people a King would be born in Bethlehem. This King would rule forever and ever. This King was the Savior they had been waiting for—Jesus Christ!

LESSON 9

We know that God sent Isaiah to Hezekiah to give him a message that God would hear his prayer. But Isaiah had another message. This was more good news for the people about Jesus. Isaiah told the people to look for a sign. A Son would be born. His name would be Immanuel, which means God with us! This Son would come to save His people from their sins. This Son that Isaiah told about was Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior.

LESSON 10

God's prophet Jeremiah had a very hard message for the people. God sent Jeremiah to warn the people to stop sinning—to stop worshipping false gods. God was getting angry with the people. God wanted the people to leave their idols and return to Him. God told the people if they would return to Him, He would protect them. But if they did not, God would bring destruction to them. This was a serious warning.

LESSON 11

The people made God angry. God had sent Jeremiah to warn them. But they would not listen. They would not stop sinning against God. Finally, God had to punish their sins. He sent an enemy—an army—to take over the land. The army destroyed the land. The people who survived the attack were taken away to Babylon—a faraway country. They had to leave their land and their homes. This was a very bad day for Judah! The people would not listen to God's warning. They did not return to God.

LESSON 12

The people had disobeyed. They were taken as prisoners to another land. This was terrible. They wanted to go home! And God sent another message to the people through His prophet Jeremiah. This message was that the people would one day come home. God would bring them back after 70 years! But for now, they were to live peacefully in the land. They were to build houses, grow gardens, and raise families. They were to trust God that His Word was true, and one day they would return home.
