God Leads Questions

As you lead your students around the room, stop at each Lesson Illustration/obstacle and ask these questions as a review of today's lesson.

LESSON ILLUSTRATION #1—ESTHER

- 1. When the servants were sent to find the prettiest ladies, God led them to this lady. What was her name? Esther.
- 2. Who did Esther worship? God.
- 3. When Esther asked all the Jews to pray, how many days did they pray? 3 days.
- 4. God led Esther to have courage to go speak to the king. Why was she afraid? It was against the law. She could be killed.

LESSON ILLUSTRATION #2—MORDECAI

- 1. What was the name of this man, Esther's cousin? Mordecai.
- 2. Was Mordecai a Jew? Yes.
- 3. Who did Mordecai worship? God.

LESSON ILLUSTRATION #3— KING AHASUERUS

- 1. Who was this man? The king.
- 2. Who did God lead him to choose as his new queen? Esther.
- 3. Who led the king to allow Esther to speak to him and not kill her? God.

LESSON ILLUSTRATION #4—THE BAD GUYS

- 1. Who did God lead to hear the evil plan of these bad guys? Mordecai.
- 2. What did they plan to do? Kill the king.
- 3. Did their plan work? No.
- 4. Who did God lead Mordecai to tell about this evil plan? Esther.

LESSON ILLUSTRATION #5—HAMAN

- 1. What was Haman's evil plan? Kill the Jews.
- 2. Did Haman's evil plan work? No.
- 3. Who led Esther, Mordecai, and the king to save the Jews? God.

God is always in control. He knows every detail! He leads us wherever we need to go. And we can trust Him! He can use us to help work His plans, like He used Esther to save the Jews. Sometimes we might not know what God is doing—like when you were blindfolded, you didn't know where I would lead you. But we can always trust God and follow Him.
